Program

Pianist Louise Thomas has concertized extensively throughout Europe, North America and Asia.

Louise Thomas completed undergraduate musicology studies at Trinity College, Dublin. She received a German Government scholarship to continue piano performance studies at the Hochschule für Musik und Theater in Hannover, Germany where she received a Konzertdiplom in the solo piano class. Dr. Thomas won second prize at the Ibla-Ragusa competition in Sicily where she was awarded the Béla Bartók Prize. She also won the concerto competition at the University of Southern California and performed with Maestro Sergiu Comissiona. Dr. Thomas received her doctorate in piano performance in 1999 from USC.

A dynamic collaborative pianist, Louise Thomas has made CD recordings in Germany (as part of the chamber music festival, "Schwetzinger Festspielen"); at the Banff Center for the Arts in Canada with the Irish Contemporary Music group, Nua Nós, and has appeared on numerous live radio broadcasts. She concertizes regularly with violinist, Elizabeth Pitcairn, in addition to appearing regularly on the acclaimed Jacaranda Series in Los Angeles.

Dr. Thomas has been invited onto the faculty of several summer programs: she was the vocal coach at the 2002 "La Fabbrica" summer program in Tuscany, and from 2003-2009, she was the Festival pianist and vocal/instrumental coach at the Idyllwild Arts Summer Academy in California. In the summer of 2011, she joined the faculty at the Luzerne International Music festival in New York State and returned as Chair of the Piano program (first session) in 2012.

Dr. Thomas joined Chapman University in 2001 as Director of Keyboard Collaborative Arts. In June 2014, she was named Associate Dean for Academic Affairs in the College of Performing Arts at Chapman.

Rebecca Sherburn is the Director of Vocal Studies and an Associate Professor of Voice at Chapman University's Hall-Musco Conservatory of Music. Her scholarly work has been published in professional journals of the National Association of Teachers of Singing, the American Choral Directors Association, and the College Music Society. She received her undergraduate degree from California State University-Los Angeles and her Master of Music and

Doctor of Musical Arts degrees from the University of Southern

California.

In addition to international performances covering a vast amount of standard vocal repertoire, Dr. Sherburn has distinguished herself as a champion of contemporary music. As a concert artist, she has premiered several works that were written specifically for her voice, and she has built a reputation for performing rarely heard contemporary chamber works. On July 1st, 2014 "Paul Creston Songs" was released by Albany Records. Dr. Sherburn's work is the only comprehensive recording of Creston's vocal opus. Work has begun on a second Albany publication entitled "Love, the Fair Day". This CD is a compilation of chamber music by composers of the Second New England School to be released in 2017.

She was the winner of such competitions as the regional Metropolitan Opera National Council auditions, Annual Aspen Voice Competition, American Opera Awards, and the Viktor Fuchs Awards. She has received grants and awards from a number of national and international foundations for scholarly and creative work. These include two Faculty Research Grants from UMKC in the area of chamber music and performance grants from the Figtree Foundation, Blount Foundation, Opera Buffs of Southern California, and the Astral Foundation. During her years of training, she was an Apprentice at the Zürich Opera in Switzerland and Virginia

Opera, a scholarship student at the Music Academy of the West, and a Chamber Music Fellow at the Aspen Music Festival.

Sherburn is particularly well known for her vocal master classes which she gives throughout the nation.

David Prather is an eclectic actor/writer who has specialized in creating unique projects for various arts institutions, as well as a veteran arts educator. His short play "Under the Concord Sky" was commissioned by the San Francisco Symphony for the American Mavericks

Festival, in which Mr.
Prather portrayed the composer Charles Ives.
He reprised the performance at Chapman University, and appeared as Ives at Segerstrom Hall with the barritone William

Sharp. He has also appeared as the composers Pytr Tchaikovsky and Dimitri Shostakovich with both the Pacific Symphony and the Thornton School Orchestra under the baton of Carl St. Clair. Additionally, as a teaching artist, he has worked with the SF Symphony's "Keeping Score" institutes for teachers, the Pacific Symphony's schools program, "Class Act", the L.A. Opera, and the Hampsong Foundation of Thomas Hampson as part of the Colburn School's "Songfest". For the Getty, he has created a number of original shows including an appearance as Chaucer, and a Baroque evening, "Imagining the Orient." Other outings include adapting and acting in Stravinsky's "Histoire du Soldat", again with the SF Symphony, and touring his play, "When Harlem Was in Voque" for the Alley Theatre of Houston. He has hosted and narrated numerous programs with the L.A. Philharmonic as well, including an eleven year stint at the helm of "Summer Sounds" at the Hollywood Bowl, and for the past eleven years as host of the annual Holiday Sing-a-Long at Disney Hall--sharing the stage with Julie Andrews and Drew Carey among others. His varied popular school assembly programs include "The Bully Dudes", "Poetry Jam" and "Yankee Doodle Poetry". Mr. Prather is a graduate of the American Conservatory Theatre of San Francisco, and Princeton University.


Certificate of Merit

Branch Honors Festival

The Honors Festival requirements are posted under the gold ribbon marked "Information." Students must also receive a rating of good or excellent in Sight Reading, Technique, and Performance. Remember, only grade 7 and above will be able to play in the Honors Festival. There just is not enough room to accommodate

everyone. All students will receive an honors seal for their CM Certificate.

If your student is recommended for Branch Honors, you must confirm online by March 12, if your student wants to play in the Festival. The Festival Recital will be held at Chapman University on March 25, 2017.

Convention Recitals

The application is available online. Go to the Certificate of Merit program page at your teacher portal. Find the application under the title ribbon "Resources". It must be filled in and signed by the CM Chair. There is an application fee. All make-ups must be completed by May 15, 2017.





Derek Brown



Derek Brown has been described by jazz journalist Scott Yanow as "performing unaccompanied solos that occasionally make one recall Bobby McFerrin in his early prime and the great saxophonist Eddie Harris...utilizing slap-tonguing, circular breathing, a wide interest in musical styles and dazzling coordination to create rather unique music." Crossing genres from jazz to classical to funk, saxophone innovator Derek's unique playing style has wowed audiences across the globe using creative new "beatbox-like" techniques. Previously the director of jazz studies at Abilene Christian University, Derek now lives and performs in Chicago, pursuing various projects around the area and throughout the world. His recent BEATBoX SAX music videos and weekly tutorials on YouTube (over 2 million views) have been very popular among saxophonists and

music lovers alike, leading to endorsements with Legere, JodyJazz, P.Mauriat, BG, and AKG. Derek's recent jazz festival performances include appearances in the US, Asia and Europe.

Julie Mckenzie



Julie McKenzie is Principal Flutist of the San Francisco Opera Orchestra, and Piccoloist of the San Francisco Ballet Orchestra, positions that she has held since 1991. She is a graduate of the San Francisco Conservatory of Music, where she was a student of Lloyd Gowen. Other teachers and mentors have included Paul Renzi, Julius Baker, Peter Lloyd and Keith Underwood. In her earlier career, Julie participated as an orchestral fellow in the Berkshire Music Festival at Tanglewood, and she was featured in a CBC television documentary with Jean-Pierre Rampal. For many years Julie was a member of the San Francisco Chamber Orchestra, the San Francisco Chamber Symphony and the Anchor Chamber Players. As a soloist, she has appeared at the Carmel Bach and Mendocino Music Festivals, and with the New Century Chamber Orchestra. She has recorded for New Albion and Teldec Records, among others.

- In Certificate of Merit, the recipient must have completed successfully, including the senior year. Level 9 for piano and other instruments, and Level 6 for voice.
- Scholarship winners and their teachers will be notified of their award after Board approval at the May, 2017 meeting.
- Scholarship checks will be sent to the student upon written verification of enrollment as a music major by the college, university, or conservatory.
