The Branch meeting on October 3 will provide the last CM training session. Teachers must attend in order to enroll students in CM. The training will be covering what is new this year such as the State Honors award. We will also be reviewing how to set up a Student Roster and how to enroll students for CM. If you have never participated in CM under the new system, it would be helpful to bring a laptop. There are several steps involved and it can get confusing for first time users.

**Blocked Teachers:** All teachers are blocked from enrolling students in CM until they attend a mandatory CM meeting. If unable to attend the meeting on Oct. 3, email Nancy Hsu at <u>nancyhsu1@netzero.net</u> She will send you an online CM quiz.

**Student Roster:** Teachers may add students to their Student Roster throughout the year. There is no deadline. Teachers are never blocked from adding students.

**CM enrollment dates**: CM enrollment is only open during the month of October.

CM Applications and initial enrollment (previously called registration) are accepted from October 1-October 31. Level, grade, Panel, and YAG must be entered by October 31. Changes to this information can be made at any time until the Application Fee payment is made. New Applications cannot be created after October 31.

**Parents/Adult students pay through their Portal**: Parents or Adult Students must pay online November 1-10. No application changes can be made after the payment is processed. Until the application payment is made, the label will say "not paid". Once the application is paid, the "not paid" will be removed. The label may still show "incomplete" until the repertoire is entered by the January 15 deadline.

**Student List:** Teachers are NOT REQUIRED to mail their Student List to the CM Chair.

**Teacher Work Agreement:** Teachers are NOT REQUIRED to sign a Teacher Work Agreement at this time. However, teachers will have to sign and complete a Teacher Job Request Form between January 2 and January 15. The number of hours is based on the number of students enrolled. If a student cancels after a parent has paid for CM enrollment, the number of hours the teacher is required to work will not change. Teachers will receive the Job Request Form by e-mail, from the Teacher Scheduling Chair. Below are the work requirements based on the number of students enrolled.

1 to 4 Students 1/2 day
5 to 10 Students1 day
11 to 15 Students 1&1/2 days
16 to 20 Students 2 days
21 to 25 Students 2&1/2 days
26 or more Students

#### Entering Repertoire, Convention, Branch Honors: Repertoire, Convention, Branch Honors, and Improvisation applications, may be entered between October 1 and January 15. These are the final steps to complete Enrollment. Until all steps are complete, your portal will say "Incomplete."

**Special Requests:** Student schedule and carpool requests must be entered from January 2-15.

#### Artist Bio

American pianist Victor Rosenbaum has concertized widely as soloist and chamber music performer in the United States, Europe, Asia, Israel, and Russia in such prestigious halls as Tully Hall in New York and the Hermitage in St. Petersburg, Russia. He has collaborated with such artists as Leonard Rose, Paul Katz, Arnold Steinhardt, Robert Mann, Joseph Silverstein, James Buswell, Malcolm Lowe, and the Brentano, Borromeo, and Cleveland String Quartets. Festival appearances have included Tanglewood, the Rockport Chamber Music Festival, Kfar Blum and Tel Hai (in Israel), Yellow Barn, Kneisel Hall (Blue Hill), Musicorda, Masters de Pontlevoy (France), the Heifetz Institute, the International Keyboard Institute and Festival in New York, the International Music Seminar in Vienna, the Bowdoin International Music Festival, and the Festival at Walnut Hill School. Concert appearances have brought him to Chicago, Minneapolis, Tokyo, Beijing, St. Petersburg (Russia), Tel Aviv, Jerusalem, and New York, among others. In addition to his absorption in the music of the eighteenth and nineteenth centuries (in particular Haydn, Mozart, Beethoven, Schubert, Chopin, and Brahms), Rosenbaum has performed and given premieres of works by many contemporary composers, including John Heiss, Peter Westergaard, Norman Dinerstein, Arlene Zallman, Donald Harris, Daniel Pinkham, Miriam Gideon, Stephen Albert, and many others. A musician of diverse talents, Rosenbaum is a prize-winning composer and has frequently conducted in the Boston area and beyond.

Rosenbaum, who studied with Elizabeth Brock and Martin Marks in his home town of Indianapolis, and went on to study with Rosina Lhevinne at Aspen and Leonard Shure (while earning degrees at Brandeis University and Princeton) has become a renowned teacher himself. A long-time member of the faculty of New England Conservatory in Boston, whose Piano Department he chaired for more than a decade, he was also on the faculty of Mannes School of Music in New York from 2004-2017. He has been Visiting Professor of Piano at the Eastman School of Music, a guest teacher at Juilliard, and presents lectures, workshops, and master classes for teachers' groups and schools both in the U.S. and abroad, including London's Royal Academy of Music, Royal College of Music, and Guildhall School, the conservatories of St. Petersburg and Moscow, Beijing Central Conservatory, the Toho School in Tokyo and other institutions such as the Menuhin School, and the

Jerusalem Music Center. He has also served on the jury of several international piano competitions.

His highly praised recording of Schubert is on *Bridge Records* and the release of the last three Beethoven sonatas on the same label was named by American Record Guide as one of the top ten classical recordings of 2005. Three discs on the *Fleur de Son* label feature music of Schubert and Mozart.

Of his Tully Hall performance, the New York Times said, simply: "He could not have been better." And the Boston Globe described him as "one of those artists who make up for all the drudgery the habitual concert goer has to endure in the hopes of finding the occasional, real right thing."
