ABOUT THIS DUO-PIANO TEAM...

Pianists, Pinió Dovalis Benetatos and Katheryn Klein began their musical association in 1988. As a duo they present innovative programs that combine standard repertory with unusual transcriptions, important contemporary works, and neglected masterpieces.

This dynamic team incorporates the worlds of art, dance and literature into their recital programs, creating a unique and multisensory experience for their audiences. Their repertoire shows great diversity and interest in all styles and periods of music: from Bach and Mozart, to the duo-suites of Rachmaninoff; to the more contemporary Lutoslawski, Grainger, Stravinsky, Poulenc and Gershwin. In addition, they often program original arrangements including other musical disciplines (i.e. violoncello, voice, percussion, violin, and trumpet). Their playing and programming prompted Joseph Sirota of the Cypress *Event* to state, "...They handily design inventive programs and daringly perform genuinely 'fresh' Duo-Piano recitals...Flawless...Powerful and Fiery."

Pinió and Katheryn were winners in the University of San Diego/MTAC Duo-Piano Competition. They have been showcased with the Aliso Viejo, Long Beach Community, Orange Coast College, Eagle Rock, San Juan Capistrano and Garden Grove Symphonies. They have also been featured artists with the San Fernando Valley Symphony performing

Poulenc's Two-Piano Concerto in D minor, and Mozart's Concerto KV 365 in E-flat Major for Two Pianos.

Sharing their playing for causes close to their hearts is another facet of this team's resume. They performed in a very successful fundraising concert for the Child Abuse Prevention Council of Orange County and are currently

planning a concert to benefit the Ronald McDonald Houses of California.

Katheryn and Pinió are active members of MTAC, MTNA, CAPMT, and the National Guild of Piano Teachers. Their students regularly win awards for their playing and several have continued on to major in music at such institutions as The University of Southern California, The Manhattan School of Music, Vanguard University, and Indiana University.

The Irvine World News said this about their 1988 debut concert:

"...Dovalis-Benetatos and Klein worked very smoothly as a unit...flawlessly synchronizing their part and trading off themes and motives with the seasoned aplomb of a veteran duo. And leave it to them to select for their first piece Igor Stravinsky's incredibly complex arrangement of"Petroushka.....".

'Dance Music for Two Pianos' will explore the relationship between movement and music from 1735-1999.

The dance forms in the program include the *Waltz* (Rachmaninoff), the *Minuet* (J.C. Bach), the *Mazurka* (Joaquin Rodrigo), the *Tango* (Igor Stravinsky and Astor Piazzolla), and dances specific to a culture or region (Brahms Hungarian Dances, Grieg Norwegian Dances, and Ernesto Lecuona's Afro-Cuban Dances).

The audience participation component won't only include listening; be sure to bring your dancing shoes!

- 1. Provide your own accompanist.
- 2. An entrant playing without an accompanist will be disqualified.
- 3. All pieces must be well memorized.
- 4. Provided sheet music of your concerto for the judges
- 5. All pieces must be in original form, no transcriptions.
- 6. Judges' decisions are final.
- 7. MTAC-OC reserves the right to modify, change, or cancel any information such as venue, time, prizes, or performance regarding the competition.
- 8. All fees are non-refundable
