Certificate of Merit

A big welcome to returning teachers and a special welcome to teachers who have recently joined the Orange County Branch. You will find that our members are helpful and friendly. We hope you will want to get involved in one or more of our many programs. There will be a new member meeting in September. The emphasis will be on the Certificate of Merit program.

When you go to your Teacher Portal, you will need to create a password. If you are a returning teacher, you may be asked to create a new password. Once you gain access to your portal, you will be asked to read the Private Policy Agreement. Click on "Agree," and type in your first and last name. When you click on Certificate of Merit, you will see a notice that you have been "temporarily blocked from participating in the CM program." This means that you cannot enroll students in CM until you are unblocked. However, you can add students to your Student Roster.

You ask, "How do I get unblocked?" It is really simple. Every member is required to attend a CM training session. We are offering two trainings and hopefully one will work for you. The first one will be Wednesday, September 18 at Southwest Conservatory. This session is geared towards new members and first time teachers to CM. The second training session will be offered at our Branch Meeting on Wednesday, October 2, at Fields Pianos. You may bring your laptop to either session. This is optional and not required.

Keep in mind that you are only blocked from enrolling students in CM. Enrollment takes place October 1-31. **Teachers are not blocked from building their Student Roster.** This can be done year around. It is recommended that you build your roster now.

That way, when enrollment begins on October 1, your students will already be in the system and their parents will have their portals set up.

There is a new starting and ending deadline for paying CM fees. Once a teacher has enrolled a student, the parent may pay online as early as October 1. The deadline to submit payment is November 5. Teachers will be allowed to change a student's CM level even if the parent has already paid. However, if the enrollment fee has increased due to the change in level, the parent will be billed for the balance. No changes are allowed after the November 5 deadline.

Teachers will be required to work during the CM evaluations. We are a nonprofit organization and therefore cannot afford to hire workers. We are the workers. The number of hours required is based on the number of students enrolled. If a student cancels after CM enrollment has closed, the number of hours the teacher is required to work will not change. A Teacher Work Contract will be e-mailed January 2, 2020. This year, we anticipate that CM enrollment could exceed 1500. For this reason, we must provide several venues to accommodate all students. Some dates cannot be confirmed until October or November. This is due to the fact that we are using college sites and they must give priority to their students. The dates below are the dates we requested. Should our request be denied, the venue will have to be changed.

2019 Branch Theme Festival

The Romantic and Impressionistic ERA

(Piano only):

This is an adjudicated festival with written comments for each student about their performances. The goal of the festival is to encourage all participants to express their understanding of musical style and to excel in performance.

The Festival consists of two parts:

Theme Festival: Each student will receive a written comment from three Judges. In addition, each student will be awarded for their performances by point system from the judges: the top 25% of students will receive gold medals, 25% silver, 25% bronze and 25% with honorable mention ribbons. One winner selected by the Judges from each division will be awarded with a trophy and one alternate winner will receive a certificate and the gold medal.

Winner's Concert: The winners selected from the Theme Festival will compete in four divisions in the Concert. The first-place winner in each division will be selected by a panel of three Judges to receive \$200 cash award. We are adding the second-place winner for a \$100 dollar award this year to encourage more students. **Theme:** The Romantic and Impressionistic Era (MTAC Piano Syllabus page 162-164 under "Category 3)

* Each student will play one piece or one movement only.

* Piece needs to be memorized * Each teacher may enter up to 20 students

* Enter/Register students' divisions according to the Theme Festival Divisions.

Teacher Involvement: Teacher are required to work on the day of Festival. Hours of work depends on the number of student registration. Teacher's none-involvement fee is \$30 dollars (less than 10 students) or \$60 dollars (more than 10 students)
