Teaching in 2020-2021

To teach in person, or online? That is the biggest question music instructors of late. After 6-7 months of teaching online (or not teaching), making the change back to studio teaching is perhaps not a simple task. As Orange County prepares to move into a new lower "risk level", this brings the potential option of teaching in person. As business owners, we are all liable for how we conduct business, whether it is at your home studio, at the student's home, or in a commercial location.

Several options are available to teachers to manage teaching 'safely' at home, including moving the lessons outdoors, if that is something you can manage, on a patio or in the garage. The

Pre-Opening Welcome Back Letter. Teachers should send a pre-reopening letter to all students and parents informing of a reopening date and all mandatory procedures that you will be implementing.

Scheduling. Schedule lessons so that there is a gap between students to reduce the number of persons in the studio at any one time and to allow for cleaning of surfaces between students.

Waiting Room. Teachers may elect to eliminate their waiting have students wait outside, and notify them via cellphone or text that it is time for them to come in. If a waiting room is used, remove magazines, toys, etc.

Screening List. instruct students not to come to the music studio if they, or anyone in their household, have or have had in the past 14 days a cough, a fever, shortness of breath, difficulties breathing, flu-like symptoms, gastrointestinal upset, or experienced a loss of taste or smell. To encourage students to be honest, the music studio may want to consider waiving any cancellation fees due to an illness, or conduct these lessons online.

Limit on Items. Restrict the items that students bring with them into the studio, such as limiting a student to a cellphone and wallet. Be prepared to sanitize areas these items touch (music stands, benches).

Hand Sanitizer. Place hand sanitizer at the entrance of the studio with specific instructions to use it prior to entering the studio and upon leaving the studio. Consider touchless faucets, sanitizer dispensers etc.

Temperature. Teachers may want to take the temperature of students as they enter the music studio. an elevated temperature is noted, the students should be instructed to proceed home.

Payment. Teachers may want to require payment by credit cards over the telephone.

Masks and Distancing. Students and teachers should be advised to wear facemasks for the duration of the lesson. For aerosol producing lessons, facemasks can be removed by students, and extra time should be scheduled between lessons to clear the air (air scrubbing). Consider plastic or Plexiglas room dividers to be placed between student and teacher.

Sanitation. Be prepared to sanitize all areas students touch (piano keys, stands, door knobs, benches etc). Do this between every lesson. Be careful to avoid excessive moisture on piano keys. Porous objects are more difficult to disinfect, so cover these surfaces with materials that can be cleaned more easily.

Branch Theme Festival will be online this year. Students will send the YouTube link for their video recording with their applications. Detailed instructions will be sent via email and posted on the Branch Website.

Below is the general information with dates (This is our first time running the Festival online. There are many details and logistics to iron out. We reserve the right to change the date to post the results). Please note the changes marked in **bold**.

Theme: The Classical Period (see CM Syllabus page 162 for list of composers)

Registration Fee: \$45 per student.

Registration Dates: October 1 to October 20 (Teachers will receive registration form via email)
Upload Video and Music Scores Dates: October 27 to November 20 (Teachers will receive

uploading form and directions via email)

Results posted online: December 20.

Rules and Regulations:

- 1) One work or one movement only per performer. Theme and Variations require the Theme and at least two Variations.
- 3) Applicant will be disqualified if the Video is different than the listed repertoire on the registration form.
- 4) There will be no late submissions past the deadline.
- 5) Each teacher may enroll up to 20 students.
- 6) Age cut-off date: November 20
- 7) All students will be award with Gold medal, Silver medal, Bronze medal or Ribbon with 25% percent for each award. Students have tie in the score will receive the same award.
- 8) There are three adjudicators for each division for the Festival. The Adjudicators will write comments and give score to each performer. They will also select one First Place Winner and one Second Place Winner from each division.
- 9) Festival division First Place Winner will participate in the Winner's Competition with the original video. Festival division winners are competing in four categories:
 - Category 1: Age 9 and below
 - Category 2: Age 10 to 12
 - o Category 3: Age 13 to 16
 - o Category 4: Age 17 and above
- 10) Three adjudicators will select one First Place Winner and one Second Place Winner. The Competition First Place Winner will receive \$200 dollars cash award; Second Place Winner, \$100 dollars
- 11) Adjudicators' decisions are final and cannot be challenged.

How To:

We will send out documentation on how to get the YouTube link. There will be a Zoom meeting with further notice to help teachers with the technical issues of posting Video and Music Score in PDF format.
