nuance" (Downbeat). A top finisher in several national and international jazz piano competitions, Siskind is a twotime laureate of the American Pianists Association and the winner of the Nottingham International Jazz Piano Competition. Since making his

professional debut juxtaposing Debussy's Etudes with jazz standards at Carnegie Hall's Weill Hall, Siskind has established himself as one of the nation's most innovative and virtuosic modern pianists.

Baroque Festival

The time to prepare your students is now. The Baroque Festival is open to all disciplines. Students of all ages and levels are welcome, including ensembles. Only original pieces from the Baroque period are acceptable. Students may only play one piece or one movement and it must be memorized. Every student will receive a Certificate of Participation.

The registration form will be e-mailed to all members by November 10. If you do not receive the registration form, contact Kookhee Hong. The deadline to register is **December 10**.

This year, our Baroque Festival will be remote. Teachers will receive instructions for how to submit their video recordings by December 10. All videos must be received by January 8. Student videos will be



divided into three separate programs, depending upon the number registered. Students and their families will be invited to the live presentation of the video programs and there will be a guest Baroque artist who will be performing in each program.



MTAC Orange County Branch Theme Festival 2020 Video Presentation Guide

Although video recordings should be of good quality, we do not require that performances be professionally recorded. Recording with a smartphone would be an acceptable recording method. Post video recordings on YouTube. Please make sure that the link is working and sharing settings allow anyone with the link to access the file.



Performance must be recorded with one fixed camera angle, focused on the performer(s). Please make sure students' hands



and faces are visible. Please see the example images of recommended camera angles. Students should dress as they would for a live, in-person performance. Video recordings should be of recent performances made after November 1, 2020. Performer must record the full length of the piece, except for Theme and Variations, which must include at least Theme and two variations.

VOCE

Wendy Castille, VOCE Chair

VOCE is a State Program of the Music Teachers' Association of California. VOCE stands for "Voice, Orchestral Instruments, and Chamber Ensembles," and is designed particularly for student musicians involved in these disciplines. The mission of VOCE is to create a forum of expanded opportunities and incentives for teachers and students to inspire young musicians to reach the highest levels of their potential. VOCE began in 1971, and continues to grow and adapt over time to best meet the changing needs of teachers and students. VOCE encompasses both a Non-Competitive track and a Competitive track in which students are categorized by instrument (vocalists, instrumentalists, and chamber music ensembles) and age division. Both the Non-Competitive and Competitive track start at the VOCE Branch Auditions.

Non-Competitive Track

Students in the Non-Competitive track perform at VOCE Branch Auditions and will receive adjudicated comments from the Judges; the focus here is on the performance opportunity and to receive constructive comments.

Competitive Track

Students in the Competitive track are selected during Branch Auditions to determine First-Place Winners, who go on to compete at the VOCE State Finals. The VOCE State Finals take place in the spring the format which is yet to be determined. First-Place Winners at State Finals perform at the VOCE Winners Recital at the MTAC State Convention, where they are declared the Winner and receive a monetary award.

This year's Branch VOCE event is planned as a socially distant live event, with one performer or small ensemble and judges, without a live audience. The location is yet to be determined, but the event date is tentatively planned to be February 28, 2021.
