
Kyla holds a Master of Music degree from Arizona State University (ASU) in opera performance and a Bachelor of Music degree from Chapman University in vocal performance and music education (pre-certification). While at ASU Kyla studied with Carole FitzPatrick and performed

a variety of operatic roles through Arizona State's Music Theatre and Opera. During her studies at Chapman,

Kyla studied with Dr. Rebecca Sherburn, Dr. David Alt, and Margaret Dehning. Kyla has also worked as a conductor and instructor with the Chapman Choral Music Camp each summer from 2013–2017 and 2019.

Connor Bogenreif, Cello

Connor Bogenreif is a active performing artist, music educator, and arts administrator. Connor serves on faculty at Chapman University's Hall-Musco Conservatory of Music, holds a position with the Long Beach Symphony, teaches cello students privately, and coaches and adjudicates ensembles at schools and festivals throughout the Southern California area. Her most recent favorite contract was in Alaska, where she sang and played piano at a theater near Denali National Park.

Pianist Michael Lewis finds great joy in the exhilarating act of cooperative musical creation which has led him to work in tandem with many musical artists in recital halls and opera companies across the country like Opera Philadelphia, Cincinnati Opera, and Arizona Opera. In 2019, Michael founded Aural Compass Projects, a non-profit music organization dedicated to performing new and lessperformed works. He lives in the Hudson Valley with his partner, CodyRay, and their three bunnies; Cooper, Oliver, and Lulu.

Asleif has participated in several young artist programs, including International Vocal Arts Institute, Brevard Music Festival, Opera Saratoga, and most recently Florida Grand Opera, and has sung several leading roles in the light-lyric and lyric-coloratura repertoire. Highlights include Pamina in Die Zauberflöte, Adina in L'elisir d'amore, Baby Doe in The Ballad of Baby

Doe, Adele in Die Fledermaus, and Tytania in A Midsummer Night's Dream. Equally at home in the concert hall. Asleif is an artist with the

GRAMMY-nominated True Concord Voices and Orchestra and has been a featured soloist internationally and nationally. She has also received top awards from many organizations, including the Metropolitan Opera Council Auditions, Classical Singer Competition, and MTNA Competition.

The format of this year's event has changed to a remote event, using video upload to YouTube for the student performances.

Google Form for Video Recording

and fill out the information. You will need the following information to fill out the form:

- Student Application Number
- Student ID Number or Ensemble ID number (ensembles do not include student ID number, only the ensemble number)
- Division Name (Ex: Solo Strings: Intermediate, Competitive)
- YouTube Video Link

All of the application information can be found on the student's VOCE application at mtac.org.

VIDEO RECORDINGS

(Submission Quality Guidelines)

- YouTube recording should be a fair representation of the Applicant's abilities.
- YouTube listing should be set to "unlisted"
- The recordings are **not** required to be of professional quality.
- The video should be a complete and original performance, with no edits allowed.
- All applicants must perform from memory (except Ensemble and "non-competitive" divisions) and with no-repeats.
- When naming the YouTube Video, <u>use the student application number. Do not include</u> teacher or student name.
- The recording must be free of background noise and distortion
- Applicants will be sent a form to submit the link for the video.
- NO video should over 9 Mins long.

Deadline to submit videos: February 20, 2021.

Results Posted: March 3, 2021.
